

## **Mohawk Valley Junior Golf Tour after The Tour Championship: Mohawk Valley Junior Golf Tour Power Rankings:**

### 16-18 Boys:

1. Seth Adams

Adams narrowly missed taking home the title at Rome in addition to all of his other accolades this year, losing by 2 strokes to Kalil. However, because of his outstanding performance this year on Tour, he was presented with the most coveted award of them all, the Player of the Year award.

2. Joel Jakubowicz

Jakubowicz finished with the low scoring average on Tour this year following his 4th place finish of 78 at Rome, and was very nearly awarded back-to-back Player of the Year awards.

3. Mike Kalil

Kalil had been having a fairly ordinary season on Tour coming into Rome, achieving no victories but many solid finishes. An even-par 72 on a difficult golf course at the Tour Championship, however, was good enough to take home one victory on the year.

4. Dan Reese

Reese completed a very good final season on Tour with another good finish at Rome, coming in 3rd place with a 77, finishing with a stroke average of just over 78.

5. Nick de Jong

de Jong will be disappointed with his performance at Rome, no doubt, but otherwise had a very solid season on Tour, finishing with a scoring average of 80.

### 13-15 Boys:

1. Ian Campbell

Campbell took a close victory home at the Tour Championship, nudging out Sam Tornatore in a playoff. That win gave Campbell his 4th win in only 8 events on Tour, a very impressive display of consistent golf.

2. Dante Migliore

Migliore finished only 2 strokes out of the playoff at Rome with a double-bogey on the 18th hole. However, he will have nothing to be ashamed of this season, as he dropped his scoring average by nearly 15 strokes from last year, finishing with an average of 76.29.

3. Sam Tornatore

Tornatore almost pulled out what would have been a very impressive victory at the Tour Championship. Still, the runner-up finish was a very good cap to a very good season for the 14-year old, who finished with a scoring average of 78.86.

4. Bobby Davenport

Davenport will undoubtedly be disappointed with his score at Rome, but other than that had a very impressive first season on Tour, being one of only five members of the 43-member division to pick up a victory this year.

5. Matt Borek

Borek, like Davenport, did not play his best at the Tour Championship, but finishes the year with the division's 6th best stroke average at 82.75.

#### 12+Under Boys:

1. Ryan Rybicki

Rybicki completed a clean sweep of the season, edging out Cameron Soja in a playoff at Rome. Rybicki won 4 tournaments outright and tied for first in 4 others, winning 2 of those playoffs.

2. Cameron Soja

Despite being somewhat inconsistent this year, Soja was the most present force in trying to defeat Rybicki, tying with him 3 times this year. He also picked up an outright victory in Dreimiller and Rybicki's absence at Twin Ponds.

3. Matt Dreimiller

Dreimiller had a very good season on Tour, finishing outside of the top 3 only once. He finishes with a scoring average of 44.71 this year, behind only Rybicki.

#### 16-18 Girls:

1. Rachel Halwig

Halwig broke 90 for the first time in an 18-hole event this year, and chose the right time to do it, narrowly beating Nic Darois by only one stroke. Halwig won 5 of the 6 events she entered this year, and finished with a scoring average of 93.33

2. Nic Darois

Darois was disappointed with her round of 90 at Rome, but only lost by one stroke on a difficult golf course. She finishes the season with a scoring average of 95.63.

#### 13-15 Girls:

1. MaryAnn Bulawa

Bulawa completed another clean sweep season, winning at Rome by 4 strokes over her younger sister. Bulawa finishes the season with a scoring average of 42.

2. Lilly Bulawa

Lilly Bulawa finished second to only her sister yet again, and finished outside of that runner-up spot only once this season. She will be an early favorite for next year in this division after finishing with an average of 48.67.

#### 12+Under Girls:

1. Sydney Bard

Bard also completed another season sweep on Tour, taking a commanding 23-stroke victory at Rome, shooting an impressive 47. Bard's scoring average this year finished at 44.75.

2. Adia Bulawa

Bulawa defeated Shulman in the final event, shooting 70 to Shulman's 78. Bulawa, only 10 years old still, finished the season with an average of 60.75.
